Sylvia Huang is an occupational therapy practitioner, educator, and researcher with more than 15 years of experience in clinical practice, teaching, neurorehabilitation, and research. She earned a Post-Professional Doctor of Occupational Therapy degree from Baylor University in 2024 and a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy from Columbia University in 2006. She is currently pursuing a PhD in Occupational Therapy at Texas Woman's University.

Her professional experience includes adjunct faculty work at Baylor University, clinical research consulting focused on virtual and augmented reality applications in rehabilitation, and occupational therapy practice in neurorehabilitation settings across acute care, inpatient rehabilitation, subacute care, and community practice. Her work has included evidence-based treatment and research related to stroke, brain injury, Parkinson's disease, and other neurological conditions.

Sylvia has been involved with Texas Occupational Therapy Association as a member, continuing education evaluator, and proposal reviewer. She has also participated in conference presentations and professional activities related to neurorehabilitation, technology integration, and occupational therapy education.
